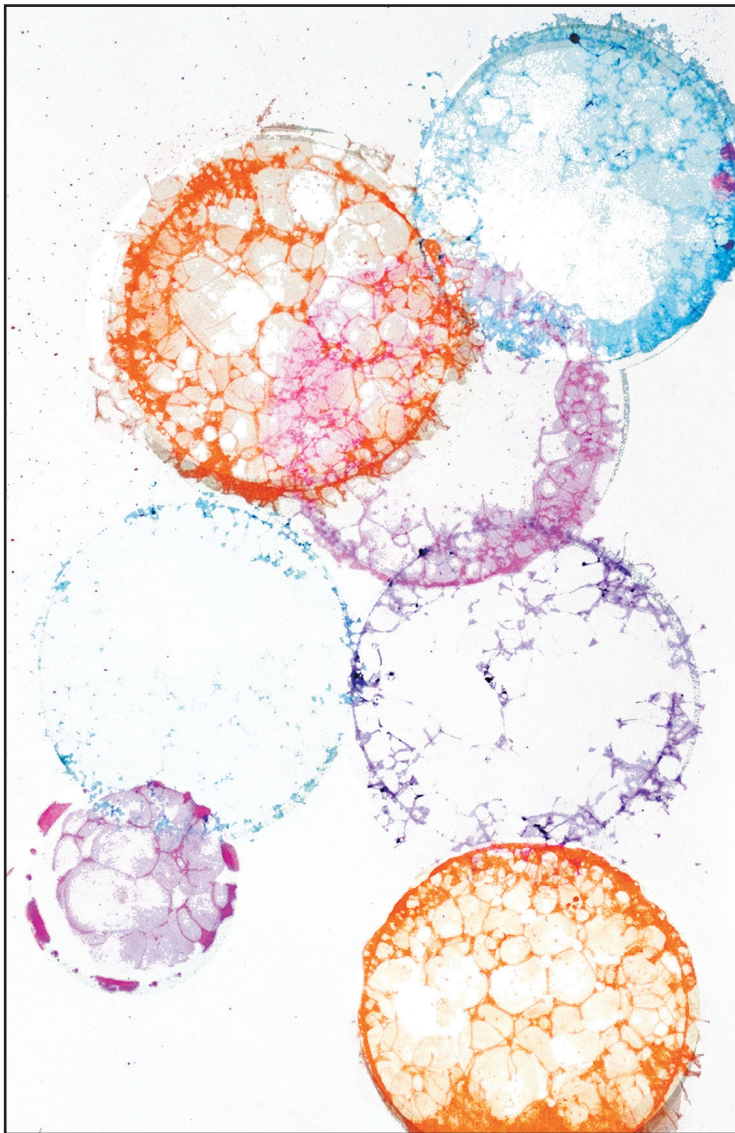


Bubble prints

Materials

- 23 x 30.5 cm white paper
- water
- liquid dishwashing detergent
- tempera paint
- plastic straws
- plastic cups or bowls
- paper towels
- measuring cup

Project notes

- Set up a workstation for small groups of children.
- Plan ahead for a place to put wet projects to dry.
- Ask an older child or an adult to blow the bubbles for younger children. For safety, use non-toxic paints and detergent.
