Steps to follow

- Children may need to experiment with this technique on a piece of scrap paper before they begin their final project. They also need to see which of the colours of paint they prefer to use in their print.
- Place the straw in the bubble mixture and blow. Blow until bubbles extend up past the lip of the cup or bowl. Remove the straw.
- Place a sheet of paper gently over the bubbles. Wait for the bubbles to pop.
- Lift the paper and marvel at the result. Set the paper aside and let it dry.
- Children may add more prints to the page and experiment with designs and colour combinations. Let the prints dry in between colour changes.

How to make the bubble mixture

Mix water, paint and detergent in equal parts in cups or bowls.

Troubleshooting hints:

• If the mixture bubbles but does not go past the rim of the cup, add water.

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- If the mixture does not bubble at all, add detergent.
- If the bubbles are too faint, add paint.
