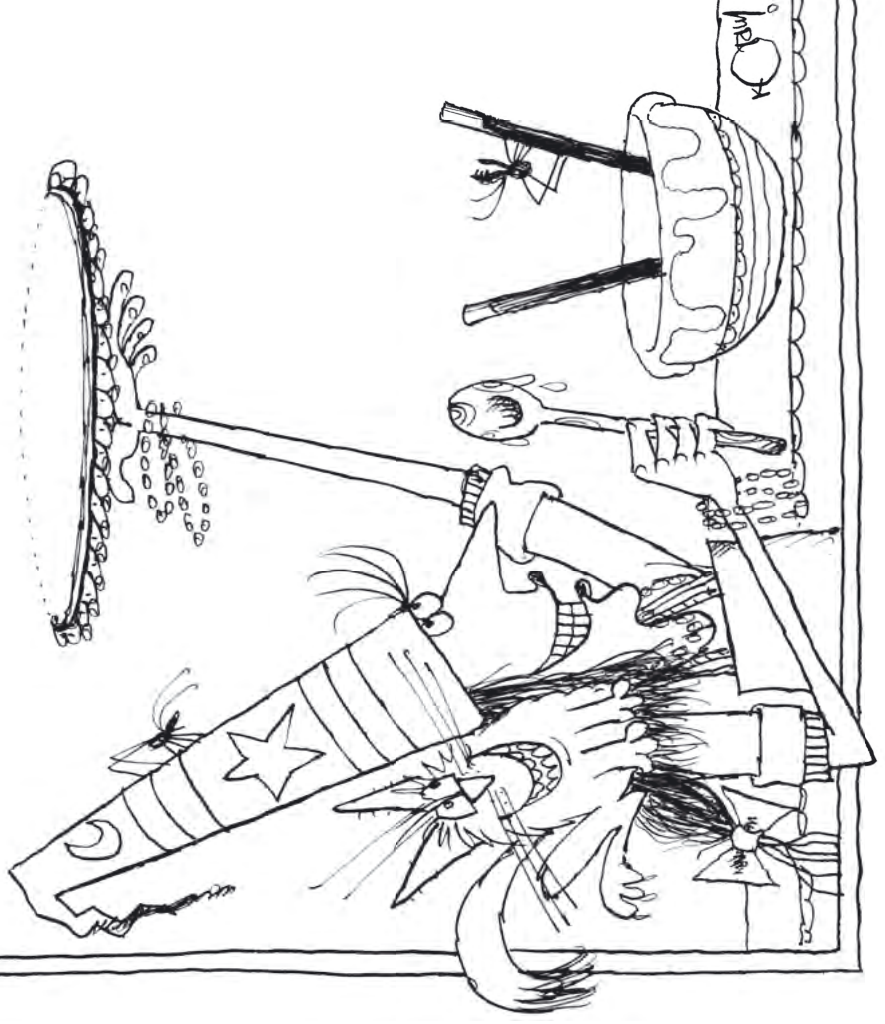

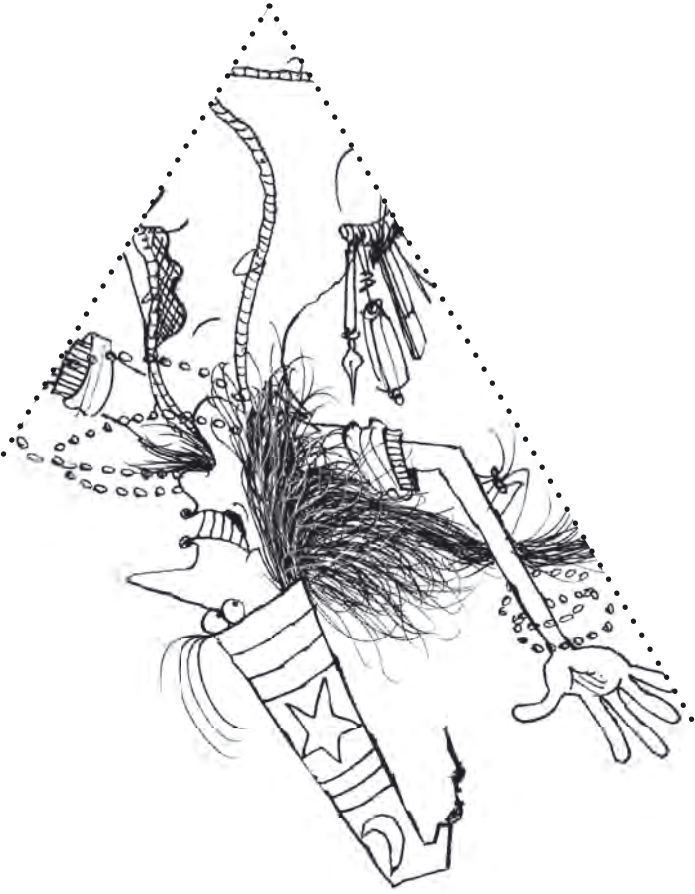

Winnie's Pumpkin Soup

1 MEDIUM PUMPKIN
500G POTATOES
1 MEDIUM-LARGE ONION
1 STOCK CUBE

KNOB OF BUTTER AND 30ML OLIVE OIL
SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE
DOUBLE CREAM TO GARNISH
HANDFUL OF FRESH CORIANDER LEAVES, CHOPPED

- Peel the pumpkin with a potato peeler.
- Chop in half and scoop out the seeds with a spoon. Chop into 2cm cubes.
- Melt the butter with the oil in a large pan.
- Peel and chop the onion. Then fry it gently in the pan, with the lid on, until it starts to soften. Check and stir to make sure it doesn't brown.
- Peel the potatoes and chop into 2cm cubes. Add to the onions in the pan and stir to coat well with the oil.
- Add the pumpkin cubes. Stir well. Cover and cook for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- When the potato has started to soften, crumble the stock cube into 1 litre of water and add to the pan. Simmer for 15 minutes until the vegetables are soft. If needed, add more water to keep the vegetables just covered.
- Mash the soup with a potato masher or put into a blender until smooth. Season to taste.
- Ladle into bowls, garnish with a swirl of double cream and some chopped coriander and serve with warm crusty bread.

You will need:

- ★ Scissors
- ★ Colouring materials
- ★ Elastic

Instructions:

- ★ Colour in your Winnie the Witch hat.
- ★ Cut carefully along the hat outline.
- ★ Cut along the black line on the left hand side of your hat to make a slit.
- ★ Guide the flap on the right hand side through the slit on the left hand side to assemble your hat.
- ★ Make two holes indicated by the two circles.
- ★ Knot elastic through these two holes to make a chin strap.

- ★ Colour in with a light colour.

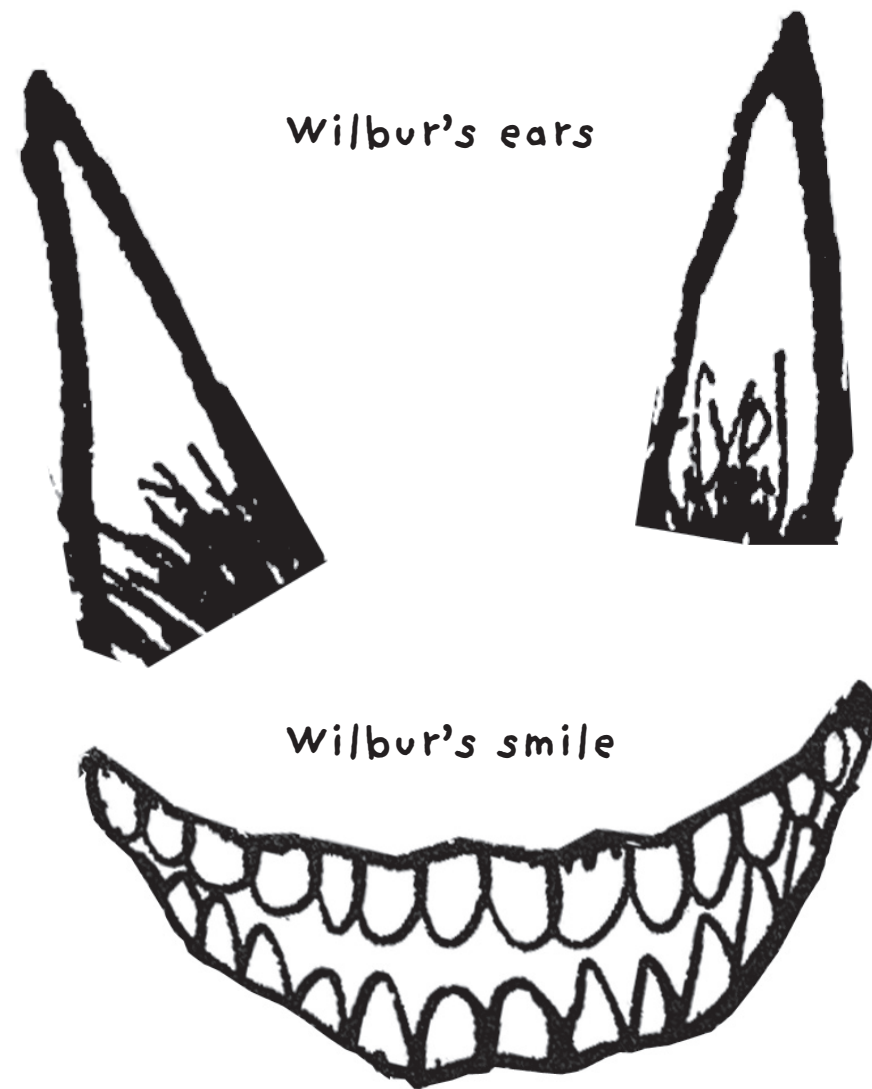
Make a Wilbur headdress!

- ★ Stick on pipe cleaners to make Wilbur's whiskers.



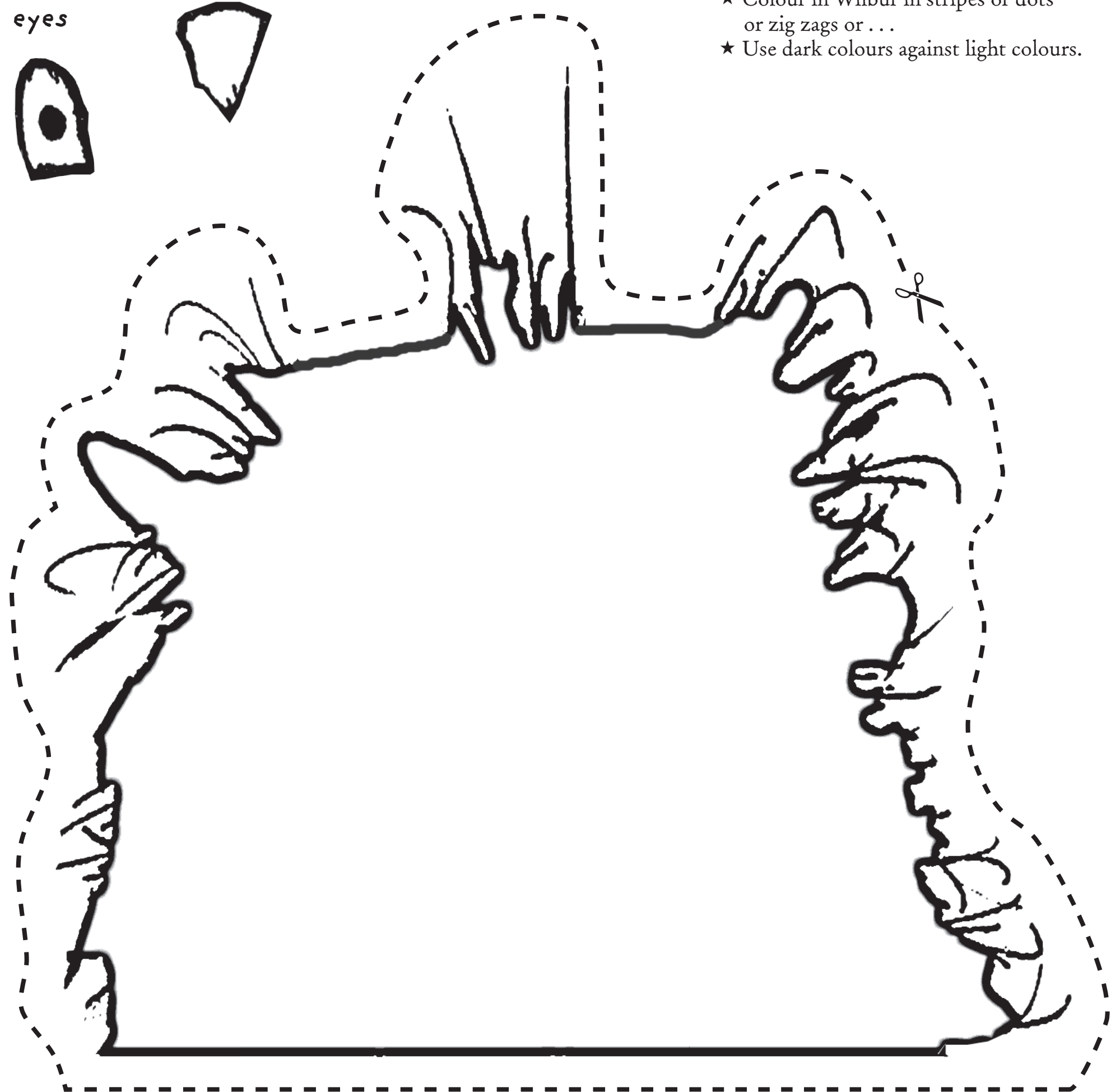
Wilbur's eyes
