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# Make a FABULOUS origami fan!



## You will need:

- One sheet of paper or card
- Colouring pencils or felt tip pens
- Tape

## Instructions:

1. Decorate your piece of paper using colouring pencils or felt tip pens. Make it as fabulous as possible!

2. Fold a one inch crease along the end of the paper, followed by another one inch crease in the opposite direction. Repeat the process until the entire paper is folded.

3. Pinch together one end of the folded paper. This will be the handle, and the other end should be open.

4. Place tape around the handle to hold it together.







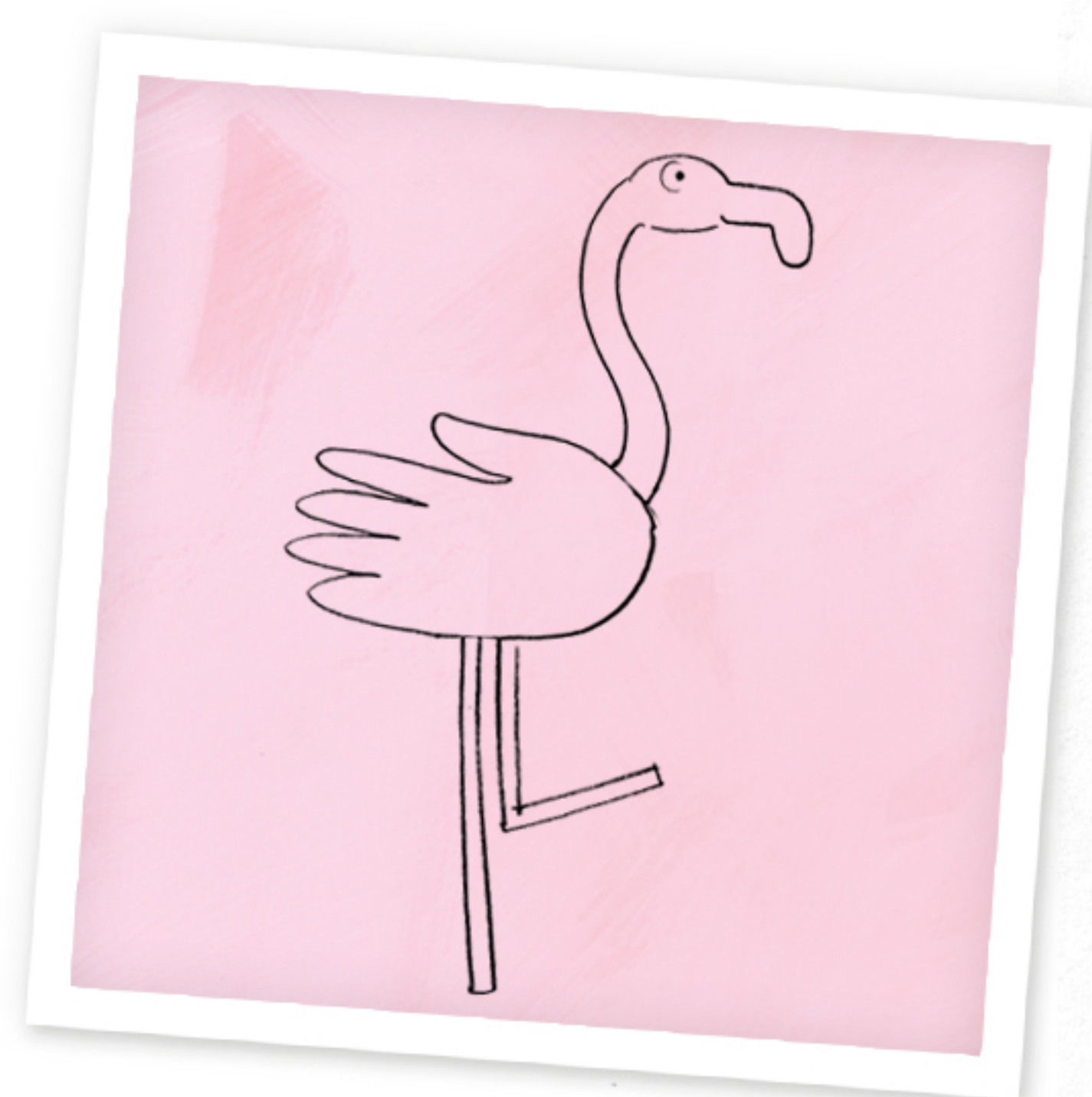
# Make a FABULOUS handprint flamingo compliment card!



Spread kindness and compliments just like Frankie with this handmade flamingo card.

## You will need:

- Pink paper/card stock
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue



## Instructions:

1. Print out the flamingo head and leg templates. Either print on pink paper, so you can cut out the templates, or trace the outlines of both the heads and legs onto pink paper. Cut to size. Colour in or draw the eyes and beak on the flamingo head.
2. Fold a piece of pink paper in half. Place your right hand on the fold line and trace the outline of your hand. You may need help with this step - have someone trace your hand or use someone else's hand to trace around.
3. Cut out the handprint, leaving the folded edge intact.
4. Position the handprint sideways, with the thumb facing up. Glue the flamingo's neck to the back of the handprint, near the thumb.
5. Glue both flamingo legs to the back of the handprint.
6. Open the card up and write a compliment or kind note to someone!



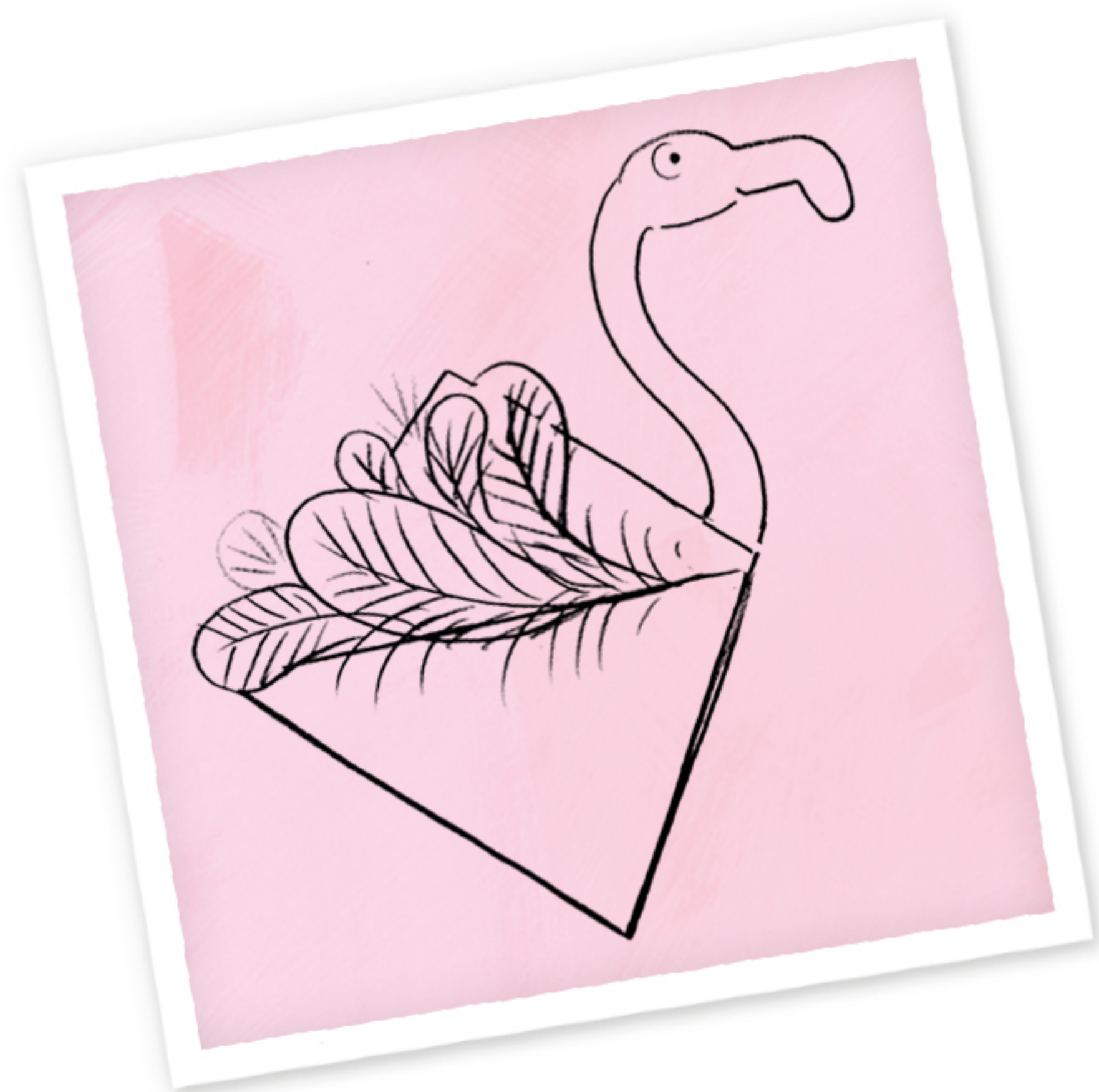




# Make your own flamingo bookmark!



This flamingo corner bookmark is one **FABULOUS** way to keep track of your reading progress!

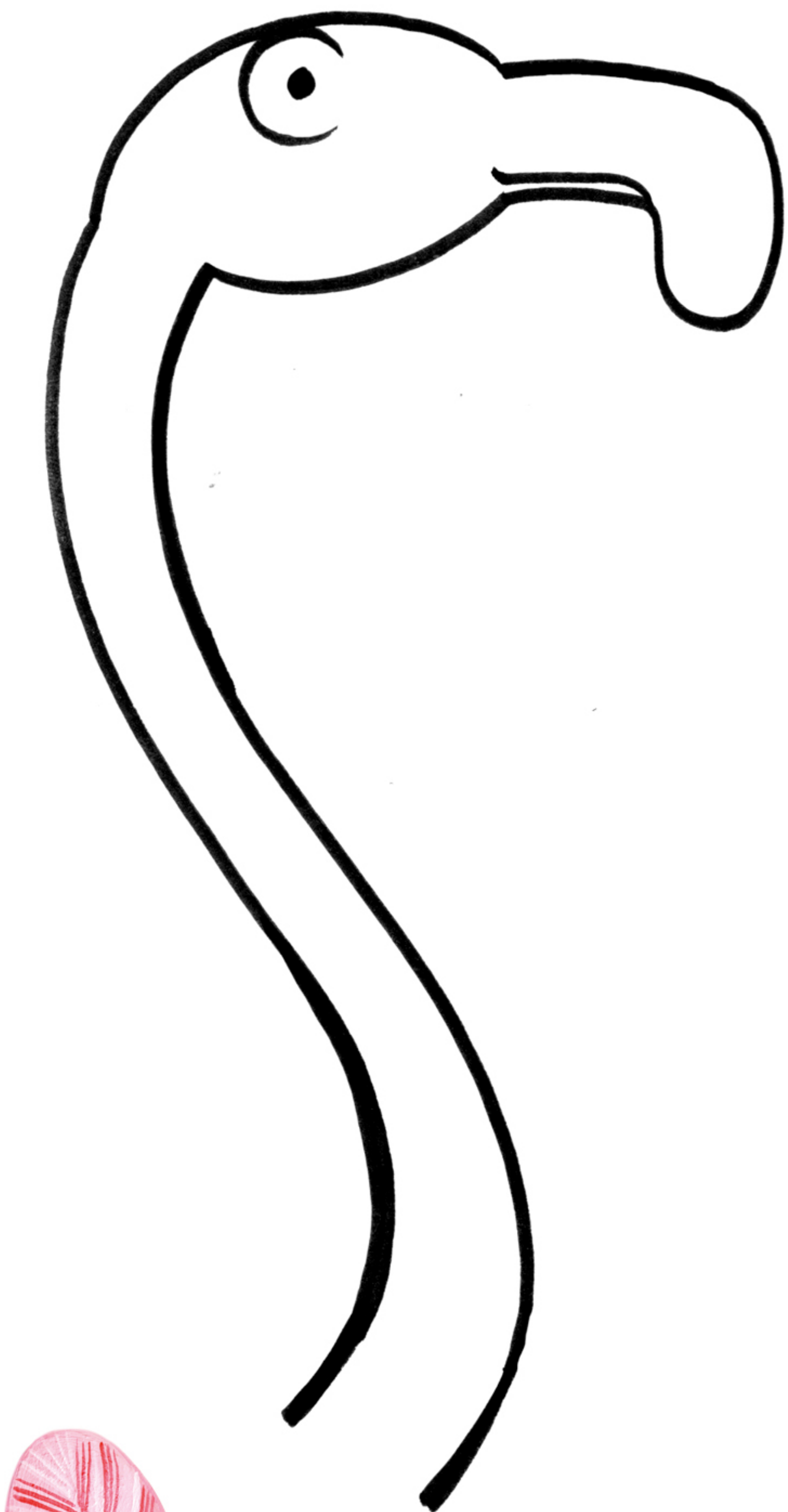


## You will need:

- Pink paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Black felt pen
- A few pink feathers

## Instructions:

1. Cut your piece of pink paper into a square. Fold in half, then in half again. When you unfold the paper, the lines should make four small squares.
2. Cut away one of the squares so only three squares remain.
3. One square will be bordered by two squares – leave this square as is. Cut the other two squares in half diagonally, so you are left with one square and two little triangles.
4. Fold the two triangles over the square and glue them together. This is the body of the flamingo.
5. Trace the flamingo head template on a piece of pink paper and cut out the shape. Glue the flamingo head to the body of the flamingo.
6. Decorate your flamingo! Add eyes, a mouth (maybe it could be coloured black or yellow), and then add loads of pink feathers over the body part of the bookmark.
7. Wait to dry and then you're done!



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# Make a kindness jar!



At the end of *Fabulous Frankie*, Frankie discovers that he is truly fabulous because he is kind to others.

A kindness jar is a great way to learn about the importance of kindness and the values of empathy.

You can do this at home yourself, filling a jar with ideas to use at a later date, or you can do it with a class!

## You will need:

- Small pieces of paper (or Post-It notes)
- Pencils
- An empty jar
- Picture of Frankie to decorate the jar



## Instructions:

1. Make the kindness jar by cutting out the picture of Frankie and glueing to the outside of the jar. Write 'KINDNESS JAR' on the outside.
2. Everyone participating in the activity writes down a random act of kindness on a piece of paper.
3. Everybody should place their piece of paper into the jar.
4. Take turns drawing an act of kindness from the jar. You could draw an act of kindness to complete each day, or everyone in class can draw an act of kindness and complete it that week.

## Ideas for random acts of kindness:

- Write a letter of appreciation to your teachers
- Arrange to pick up litter in the playground or local park
- Collect donations for a local food bank
- Offer to tidy the classroom
- Donate books to your school library
- Give someone a compliment
- Help your parent / carer with some chores
- Leave a note saying "You're the best!" for someone to find
- Let someone go ahead of you in a queue
- Ask a friend if they need any help with anything
- Do a sponsored read-a-thon for your favourite charity
- Read a book aloud to someone else, so they can enjoy the story too
