









Teacher Version:

Teacher notes overlaid on reading spreads



PREDICT

Say: I am looking at the illustrations and I can see aliens kicking watermelons.

I am thinking we might find out why they are kicking watermelons.

READING

Say: Let's read the sentences and the speech bubbles together.

Ask: Did we find out why they were kicking the watermelons? Not exactly. What did we find out? Let's read the words that tell us.

CLADIEN

Ask: Are there any words you didn't know the meaning of?

Say: Put your finger on the word that says, aliens.

What is an alien?

Why do you think aliens are saying bla, bla, bla? (This is how aliens might talk.)

Put your finger on the word that says, saw.

What does saw mean here?


UESTIONING

Say: I am wondering if the aliens know what watermelons are.

What do you think?

Let's talk about that.

Accept all possible answers and encourage



PREDICT

Say: I am looking at the photograph and I can see the snowshoe hare is all white now. I am thinking we will find out why the snowshoe hare is white.

READING

Say: Let's read the sentences together.

Ask: Did we find out why the snowshoe hare is white? We didn't exactly, but we have a clue. Let's read the words that give us a clue.

CLARIFY

Ask: Are there any words you didn't know the meaning of?

Say: Put your finger on the words that say, look and look.

What one word could be used instead in this sentence? (search)

QUESTIONING

Say: I am wondering why the snowshoe hare can change colour.

What do you think?

Let's talk about the

Accept all possible answers and encourage discussion.

SUMMARISING

Say: What we have just read was mainly about how the snows hoe hare adapts to its environment.
