

In like a lion, out like a lamb

STEPS TO FOLLOW

1. Colour in and cut out the patterns.
2. Fringe the outside edge of the yellow plate. Glue the lion's head in the centre.
3. Glue the lamb's head in the centre of the white plate. Add the ears and cotton wool balls.
4. Glue the two cards to the yellow card.
5. Punch a hole in the edge of the white plate and the corner of the yellow paper. Insert the wool through both. Tie the ends together.
6. Tape the craft stick to the back of the yellow plate. Glue the back of the white plate to the back of the yellow plate. Allow the glue to dry.



AGE RANGE: 5-11 years

This 'flip-around' puppet illustrates the old weather saying about the month of March – 'In like a lion, out like a lamb'. Children may want to extend the flip-around puppet by using other old saying. The puppets could be used as a literacy or drama activity.

MATERIALS

- the patterns and template on the following page
- two 18cm paper plates, one yellow and one white
- 6 x 10cm yellow card for the label
- cotton wool balls
- craft stick
- wool or string
- hole punch
- scissors
- tape
- glue
- crayons, marker pens, or coloured pencils
